





Blocking:

Setup Restrictions on Device

Restrict what the child can do on phone

“Free”

On your iPhone:

- Launch the Settings app on your iPhone or iPad.
- Tap on General.
- Tap on Restrictions.
- Tap on Enable Restrictions if you don't have them enabled already. ...
- Choose a 4-digit passcode that only you will know.



Random Inspection

- Look at your child's phone and check it out
- Tell them you are going to check things out from time to time with no warning
- Keep child's phone in Master bathroom at night depending on age





Set parental controls for Xbox 360

Overview

The Xbox 360 console lets you customize and manage your family's access to games, movies, and television content. The Xbox 360 parental controls can be used to control both the console itself and access to content on Xbox Live, including:

- Which games can be played.
- Which movies and TV shows can be watched.
- How long each family member can use the console on a daily or weekly basis.
- Whether or not a family member can access Xbox Live.

- This article explains how to set parental controls on Xbox 360. For instructions on how to change online safety and privacy settings, see [Xbox 360 online safety and privacy settings](#).
