Three Things You Find In The Wilderness

Luke 4:1-13 (NLT)

¹ Then Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan River. He was led by the Spirit in the wilderness, ² where he was tempted by the devil for forty days. Jesus ate nothing all that time and became very hungry. ³ Then the devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, change this stone into a loaf of bread." ⁴ But Jesus told him, "No! The Scriptures say, 'People do not live by bread alone." ⁵ Then the devil took him up and revealed to him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. ⁶ "I will give you the glory of these kingdoms and authority over them," the devil said, "because they are mine to give to anyone I please. ⁷ I will give it all to you if you will worship me." ⁸ Jesus replied, "The Scriptures say, 'You must worship the LORD your God and serve only him." ⁹ Then the devil took him to Jerusalem, to the highest point of the Temple, and said, "If you are the Son of God, jump off! ¹⁰ For the Scriptures say, 'He will order his angels to protect and guard you. ¹¹ And they will hold you up with their hands so you won't even hurt your foot on a stone." ¹² Jesus responded, "The Scriptures also say, 'You must not test the LORD your God." ¹³ When the devil had finished tempting Jesus, he left him until the next opportunity came.

THREE THINGS JESUS LOST & FOUND IN THE WILDERNESS

Lost: Fresh bread to satisfy his stomach Found: The nourishment of God's Holy Word

Luke 4:4 (NKJV)

But Jesus answered him, saying, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word of God.' " This first temptation addressed our Lord's view of <u>RESOURCES</u>.

Lost: Rulership over the kingdoms of the world

Found: Worshiping and serving God alone

Luke 4:8 (NKJV)

And Jesus answered and said to him, "Get behind Me, Satan! For it is written, 'You shall worship the LORD your God, and Him only you shall serve.' "

The second temptation tested our Lord's view of **RESPONSIBILITY**.

Lost: Presumptuous faith that elevates self over God

Found: True faith that doesn't test God but trusts God

Luke 4:12 (NKJV)

And Jesus answered and said to him, "It has been said, 'You shall not tempt the LORD your God.'" The second temptation tested our Lord's view of <u>REPUTATION</u>.

Jesus was "*filled with the Spirit,*" and was then "*led by the Spirit*" (Luke 4:1) but after His testing in the wilderness Jesus returned in the "*Power of the Spirit*" (Luke 4:14).
