TOP FINANCIAL CAUSES OF DIVORCE

- (1) Spending: 56%
- (2) Lack of communication about the finances: 29%
- (3) Exclusion from decision-making (10%) plus Other (5%): 15%

A new study by Jeffrey Dew at Utah State University attempts to quantify that risk. 2 Corinthians 9:10 (TEV) And God, who supplies seed for the sower and bread to eat, will also supply you with all the seed you need and will make it grow and produce a rich harvest from your generosity.

2 Corinthians 9:6-9 (TEV) 6 Remember that the person who plants few seeds will have a small crop; the one who plants many seeds will have a large crop. 7 You should each give, then, as you have

decided, not with regret or out of a sense of duty; for God loves the one who gives gladly. 8 And God is able to give you more than you need, so that you will always have all you need for yourselves and more than enough for every good cause. 9 As the scripture says, "He gives generously to the needy; his kindness lasts forever."
