Acts 8 - Faith Indestructible

Acts 8:1-4 Pastor Carl Toti June 25-26, 2016

We possess a faith that is *indestructible*.

You can slay the messenger but can never silence the message!

Acts 8:1 (AMPC)

¹ AND SAUL was [not only] consenting to [Stephen's] death [he was pleased and entirely approving]. On that day a great and severe persecution broke out against the church which was in Jerusalem; and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles (special messengers).

Acts 8:2 (AMPC)

² [A party of] devout men with others helped to carry out and bury Stephen and made great lamentation over him.

Devout men. Greek transliteration: eulabés. This Greek word has been translated: pious, godly and god-fearing.

Devout Men: Four Key usages of this word in the NT.

1. Simeon. (Luke 2:25)

- 2. Jews Assembled in Jerusalem for Pentecost. (Acts 2:5)
- 3. Devout men who buried Stephen. (Acts 8:2)

Ezra 9:3 (CEV)

³ This news made me so angry that I ripped my clothes and tore hair from my head and beard. Then I just sat in shock.

Nehemiah 13:25 (NLT)

²⁵ So I confronted them and called down curses on them. I beat some of them and pulled out their hair. I made them swear in the name of God that they would not let their children intermarry with the pagan people of the land.

4. Ananias. (Acts 22:12)

Acts 8:3-4 (AMPC)

³ But Saul shamefully treated and laid waste the church continuously [with cruelty and violence]; and entering house after house, he dragged out men and women and committed them to prison. ⁴ Now those who were scattered abroad went about [through the land from place to place] preaching the glad tidings, the Word [the doctrine concerning the attainment through Christ of salvation in the kingdom of God].

RESUME OF A HATER

(Saul of Tarsus)

BACKGROUND

Born in Tarsus of Cilicia - Acts 21:39; 22:3; 23:34

Cilicia was a Roman province in SE Asia Minor (modern Turkey).

A Hebrew of Hebrews (his genealogy traceable back to Abraham both paternally and maternally) - *2 Cor. 11:22, Phil. 3:5.*

Of the tribe of Benjamin - Rom. 11:1.

Born a Roman citizen - Act. 22:25-29

Birth date probably around the time of Jesus' birth.

EDUCATION

Educated in Jerusalem under Gamaliel, a highly respected Pharisee and teacher of the Law - **Acts 5:34-40; 22:3.**

Saul was an exceptional Pharisee - Phil. 3:5.

Excelling beyond his contemporaries - Gal. 1:13-14.

SKILLS

Accomplished tent-maker - Acts 18:1-3.

CHARACTER

A zealot who persecuted Christians, concerning the Law of God blameless - Phil. 3:6.

Served God out of a pure conscience - 2 Tim. 1:3; Acts 23:1

Ignorant of his blasphemy and persecution - 1 Tim. 1:12-13.

EXPERIENCE

Present at the death of the first Christian martyr - Acts 7:57-58.

Accessory to murder consenting to the death of Stephen - Acts 8:1;22:20.

Entered homes, dragging out men and women to prison - Acts 8:3; 22:4.

Entered synagogues, arresting and abusing those who trusted in Messiah - Acts 22:19.

Possessed a single-minded focus to destroy the church - Gal. 1:13

¹⁵ This is a trustworthy saying, and everyone should accept it: "Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners"—and I am the worst of them all. ¹⁶ But God had mercy on me so that Christ Jesus could use me as a prime example of his great patience with even the worst sinners. Then others will realize that they, too, can believe in him and receive eternal life. ¹⁷ All honor and glory to God forever and ever!
